Home First –

To provide rapid social assessment and support to Torfaen residents at the Emergency Departments (EDs) in Nevil Hall and Royal Gwent Hospitals

To avoid unnecessary admissions to hospital

To promote well being and independence

 <p>Integration</p>	<p>The Home Smart initiative pulls together all parts of the Local uthority and Helth Board systems to ensure there all patients regardless to their post code have access to the same level of rapid assessment and support options</p>
 <p>Long-term</p>	<p><i>Research and evidence confirms that unnesesary admissions or extended stays to hospital for elderly frail patients cause more halm because the patients loose their independence very quickly and are subject to hospital acquired infections. Evidence also supports the view that hospital based staff over subscribe social care on discharge which raises the patients level of dependency. Through rapid assessment and proportionate assessment and support, clients / patients will only be getting the support they need for discharge and not any 'just in case' provision. This approach will enable the client to retain independence for longer and therefor have less pull against statutory resources providing a more sustainable model.</i></p>
 <p>Prevention</p>	<p><i>As above , this model of delivery provides early intervention and promotes independence.</i></p>
 <p>Collaboration</p>	<p>This is a partnership arrangement between the five Gwent Authorities and ABuHB which is an excellent example of collaborative working. The 'rapid assessors' will be hosted by Newport City Council and will assess on behalf of the five Local Authorities with in the EDs</p>
